

Statutes

1. General Information

- 1.1. Young Greens of Georgia is an independent and autonomous youth organisation affiliated with Mtsvaneebi – the Greens of Georgia.
- 1.2. The name of the organisation is საქართველოს ახალგაზრდა მწვანეები (Sakartvelos Akhlagazrda Mtsvaneebi).
- 1.3. Young Greens of Georgia in accordance with its aims and objectives operate in the full territory of Georgia and beyond the borders.

2. Aims and Objectives

- 2.1. Environmentalism, social justice, solidarity, equality, sustainable future, establishing democratic principles and green political course in Georgia.
- 2.2. Increasing awareness with the members of YGG on the following issues: ecology, equality, democracy, global solidarity, class issues, mental health and social justice.
- 2.3. Increasing the participation of youth in the decision-making.
- 2.4. Creating opportunities for those young greens who are interested in Green Politics in order to take part in the struggle against systemic changes.
- 2.5. Encouraging young people living in the regions to become interested in green politics and other issues connected with social justice.
- 2.6. Mobilising Caucasian young greens for cooperation and common coordinated activities; development of common vision and solutions of problems.

3. Main areas of activities

- 3.1. Communication with the public, campaigns, supporting communities, implementing projects, advocacy, organising public lectures, seminars, forums, debates, etc.

4. Membership

- 4.1. Every person who is younger than 35 and older than 16, aligns with the political platforms and statutes of young greens, can become a member.
- 4.2. Members are accepted by application and after a meeting.
- 4.3. The decision is made by the Executive Committee.
- 4.4. Members of the organisation shall pay 10 GEL as a membership fee.
- 4.5. Members of the organisation have a right to vote.
- 4.6. Members have a right to call for an extraordinary General Assembly.

- 4.7. Members have a right to have information about the work of the organisation from the Executive Committee and the office.
- 4.8. Members have a right to take part or plan projects/programs of the organisation.
- 4.9. Members have a right to introduce their ideas regarding the new activities projects and campaigns to other members and the executive committee.
- 4.10. Membership is ceased:
- 4.11. One's own request.
- 4.12. If one's actions go against the principles of YGG and violate statutes and IRPs.
- 4.13. If a member does not take part in an activity during a year, the executive committee after meeting with the person makes a decision about the status.
- 4.14. When one turns 35.
- 4.15. Death.
- 4.16. In other cases provided by law.
- 4.17. The executive committee should be notified about the involvement of the members in international activities.

5. Structure.

- 5.1. The highest decision-making body of YGG is the General Assembly.
- 5.2. Between the General Assemblies, the governing body is the Executive Committee which is elected by the General Assembly.
- 5.3. YGG has the right to cooperate with other organisations.
- 5.4. Office employees should be members of the organisation.
- 5.5. Only members of YGG have a right to act in the name of the organisation after the consultation with the Executive Committee.
- 5.6. Only the General Assembly and Executive Committee has a right to make the decision regarding the organisation.

6. General Assembly

- 6.1. The General Assembly is the highest decision making body of YGG.
- 6.2. The General Assembly is the gathering of members of Young Greens.
- 6.3. The decisions during the General Assembly are made by the delegates with a simple majority, the changes of statutes require a simple majority. Those members who are not able to attend the General Assembly can take part in the decision making using online video or voice participation.
- 6.4. The General Assembly is taking place on an annual basis.
- 6.5. An extraordinary General Assembly can be called with the 2/3 majority of the members or 2/3 majority of the Executive Committee.
- 6.6. The General Assembly determines the number of members of the Executive Committee YGG and elects the Executive Committee.

- 6.7. General Assembly debates amends and adopts the activity plan of the following year tabled by the executive committee.
- 6.8. General Assembly debates amends and adopts the political documents, statutes and internal rules of procedure.
- 6.9. The General Assembly decides upon the reorganisation and dissolution of the organisation with 2/3 majority of the membership.
- 6.10. The General Assembly listens to the annual financial and activity report of the Executive committee.
- 6.11. The General Assembly can amend, change or revert the decisions made by the Executive Committee.

7. Liquidation or reorganisation

- 7.1. The reorganisation shall happen according to the law.
- 7.2. Liquidation shall happen in the following cases: the organisation reaches its aims, bankruptcy or repeal of registration.
- 7.3. In case of liquidation, all activities should be completed, claims should be determined, the remaining property should be indicated in money, creditors should be satisfied and the remaining property should be distributed among authorized persons.
- 7.4. The persons determined to receive the property are authorized by the court. The remaining property shall be transferred to one or several non-entrepreneurial (non-commercial) legal entities which serve the same or similar purposes as the liquidated YGG. In case of the absence of such organisation then the decision that the remaining property shall be transferred to the charitable organisation or the state.
- 7.5. The information regarding liquidation shall be published. The property can be distributed after the year of publication.
- 7.6. Liquidation is carried by the Executive Committee. In case of extraordinary circumstances, the court can appoint other liquidators. Liquidators are responsible as the executive committee.

8. Executive Committee

- 8.1. The executive committee is elected by the General Assembly.
- 8.2. The Executive Committee is responsible for the coordination of the YG G.
- 8.3. The Executive Committee is responsible to present the annual financial and activity report to the General Assembly.
- 8.4. The Executive Committee, along with the office, is responsible for the General Assembly.
- 8.5. Executive Committee after the consultation hires and fires the employees.
- 8.6. The Executive Committee has a right to ask for an activity report, including a financial report, to the responsible person.

8.7. An executive Committee member has a right to get appointed to another position in the organisation during the mandate.

9. Internal Rules of Procedure

10. IRPs are the more detailed version of the statutes.

11. IRPs shall always be protected and respected.

12. IRPs can be amended during the General Assembly with a simple majority.
