My long-term plans would be to expand on the European LGBTIQ+ Rights informal workshop that Mina and I organised during the 2019 General Assembly.

I am especially motivated to work on these following recent proposals from the UK government that would see further restrictions placed on transgender persons. The resurgent far-right parties and their attacks on Europe's LGBTIQ+ community.

I would like to see more FYEG representation at our member organisations annual meetings to help raise our profile. This will also help us to be accountable to those who may not be aware of the work that we do.

I would like to see the Executive Committee reach out to member organisations to see what support and expertise we can offer. I am obviously interested in ensuring the Young Greens of Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, and England post Brexit can continue to be involved in events where the funding for travel and accommodation has come from the European Parliament.
